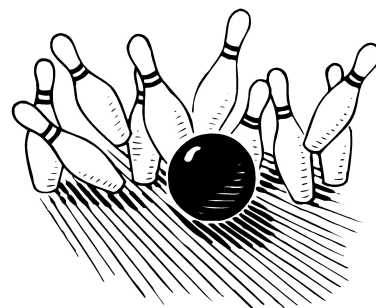

Health-Related Internships, Spring Quarter Pass Times

The online HRI system provides current UC Davis students with an opportunity to browse and select health-related internships each quarter in health fields including medicine, physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, dentistry, pharmacy, optometry, nutrition, and public health. Once you register for a pass time, you will be able to browse internships.

- The earliest possible pass time starts Feb. 28th at 9:00 am
- The HRI system will close on Mar. 5th at 5:00 pm

Most internships require a commitment of 40 hours per quarter (four hours per week for 10 weeks). Be sure to review the requirements for participation including immunizations, class status, coursework, etc. Read the internship details carefully and be prepared to attend all mandatory orientation meetings. If the internship you wanted is full, join a waitlist and attend the orientation so you will be eligible for slots that open up.

Financial Support

File your 2014-2015 FAFSA or Dream Act Application by March 2!

This is a friendly reminder to file your 2014-2015 FAFSA or Dream Act Application by March 2, the priority deadline. It is important to note the following:

- Include our school code, 001313.
- University Grant funds are limited and awarded to eligible students based on their need and their FAFSA or Dream Act application filing date; available funds are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.
- For State funding consideration, you must file by March 2 and complete a GPA verification form with CSAC (only applicable for new Cal Grant recipients).
- If your (or your parent's) taxes will not be finalized by March 2, you can still file your application by using last year's estimates. Once your (or your parent's) 2013 taxes have been completed, be sure to either update your FAFSA using the IRS Data Retrieval process (if eligible) or update your FAFSA or Dream Act Application manually.
- Be sure to file the application even if you believe you will graduate by the end of Summer 2014, just in case you need to take additional coursework.

Getting Transcript Notation

Want Transcript Notation (TN) for your internship? Want TN for doing research with a professor? Many students who participate in internships or research at UC Davis are not aware they can receive Transcript Notation (TN). The Internship & Career Center offers Transcript Notation to students who work at an approved and supervised internship for at least 40 hours per quarter. With just a bit of online paperwork, you can have your internship title, location and quarter taken noted on your official UC Davis transcript.
