Lab Assistant Pacific EcoRisk**

Environmental Aquatic Toxicology Lab in Fairfield, CA has an entry-level Lab Assistant position (part-time or full-time) open for immediate hire. Student Tissue Culture Lab Assistant

Location: Davis, California

Assist with the preparation of tissue culture media, transfer of tissue culture explants, and organization and cleaning of lab glassware and equipment. Additionally the student assistant is responsible for the maintenance and training of container grown grape vines; collecting and training field grown vines, and the track and organization of the nursery

Ophthalmology Research Intern**

Location: UC Davis School of Medicine on the UC Davis Campus

The lab is investigating molecular mechanisms for both normal aging and age-related diseases leading to blindness. Our long term goal is to identify viable targets for therapy to prevent vision loss. The laboratory is in the Dept. of Ophthalmology, and provides interactions with MDs: residents, fellows and retina surgeons; thus, it is ideal for students planning to attend medical or graduate school. Laboratory tasks to include, but not limited to: General lab maintenance, RNA and DNA isolations, qPCR, genome engineering, microarrays, tissue culture, immunohistochemistry, in situ hybridization and animal handling.

Inhalation Toxicology Research Intern (Full time/Temporary)

Location: Silver Spring, Maryland

As a subordinate element of the U.S. Army Medical Research and Materiel Command (USAMRMC), the institute conducts research for development of medical countermeasures to treat exposure to various chemical threat agents. The candidate will have focuses in: assisting with applied laboratory based experiments and producing data on the effects of various inhaled chemical agents and medical countermeasures in various animal species. Other focuses will include: participating in animal research and the handling and collection of tissues from animals exposed to various chemicals, all in compliance with IACUC protocols and learning to compile, analyze, and present experimental data using various spreadsheet, statistical analysis, and presentation programs.

Internship - Malaria Vaccine (Full time/Temporary)

Location: Silver Spring, Maryland

The Malaria Vaccine branch at Walter Reed Army Institute of Research is looking for someone to work full time for twelve months on developing vaccine antigen delivery platforms. The participant will have a mentor to work with on on-going research. The participant will learn protein expression, purification and characterization (bacteria culture, HPLC, FPLC, SDS-PAGE, ect..). The participant will also have the opportunity to learn immunological assays such as ELISA and ELISPOT.

ChemWiki Student Assistant (Part Time)

Location: Davis, California

The ChemWiki student assistant will design pages and update content for the the STEMWikis of the online Hyperlibrary project (see ChemWiki.ucdavis.edu). Experience with WordPress and other Blog or content management systems applications (or a desire to learn) is desired as is knowledge of website organization and design, (e.g., HTML). Although not required, a general interest in science communication and chemical/biological sciences is also preferred. The designer will work under faculty supervision to design and update pages, where creativity and design ideas are encouraged. The ability to work both independently and collaboratively is essential. Other duties as assigned.

Animal Behavior and Rescue Intern (unpaid)**

Location: Davis, California

Yolo County's SPCA (Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals) is looking for interns that are able to commit at least 2 hours a week for 20 weeks to interact with foster dogs at events, encourage socialization, assist with dog-dog interactions and supervise play groups.

Surgical Research Intern (unpaid)**

Location: Davis, California

Assist in a Surgical Research Facility on the Davis Campus, sponsored by the School of Medicine. Learn to restrain pigs, sheep and rabbits for surgical procedures as well as learn skills such as venipuncture, intubation, maintenance of general anesthesia and pre and post-op care. You will also prepare surgical packs, run an autoclave, prepare the Operating Room for surgical procedures, clean the Operating Room following surgery, perform inventory and general lab maintenance.
