ETX 198-011, "Chemical Food Safety"

Mondays and Wednesdays, 4:10-5:30 p.m. in 205 Olson

CRN# 43720; 3 units

Instructor: Dr. Charlie Li, Adjunct Professor, Department of Environmental Toxicology

This course will be an upper-division undergraduate course offered through the Department of Environmental Toxicology. The new Food Chemical Safety course will cover all aspects of chemical risks in the food chain, predominantly with the biologically active components of food, additives, contaminants. The course will help students understand how compounds enter and pass through the food processing and production and how to prevent them. Lectures will cover both theory and practical applications of chemical safety in food industry and food service. Some of examples of important food chemical safety issues will be given. Risk assessment and management, and food safety regulations within US and international countries will be discussed as well. The new course will be suitable for students majoring in environmental toxicology, food science, nutrition and other area.

ETX majors may count this course as a Restricted Elective with their faculty advisor approval.

The lab studies the evolution of transcription networks and pathogenicity in Candida albicans, a commensal fungus that can cause severe infections in immunocompromised individuals. Water Quality and Riparian Restoration Ecology Internship

When: Summer 2014

Where: Davis, CA; fieldwork throughout Yolo County

The Cadenasso Lab is looking for 2-4 interns to assist with a project examining water quality in restored and unrestored agricultural streams. The work will be done primarily on field sites throughout Yolo County. You will work closely with a graduate student, who will provide transportation. There is potential for a variety of additional work and/or outcomes if interns wish to stay involved for the fall quarter. The internship is unpaid, but interns can earn up to 14 units (10 - 40 hours per week). Students must be available for full 8 hour work day(s) at least 1 day a week, and more availability is preferred. Students should be a junior or senior studying an ecology-related major or minor.

Interns will assist in stream and riparian health assessments and with water quality sampling. There will be training on stream and vegetation field sampling techniques and, if desired, students may develop independent projects related to the work. Osher Re-Entry Scholarship Program

The Bernard Osher Foundation, based in San Francisco, was established in 1977 to provide support for the arts, education, the environment, health care, and social and community projects. In July, 2008, the Foundation recognized the value of the UC Davis Re-Entry Program and awarded the campus a \$1,000,000 endowment to fund a scholarship program for students 25-50 years old. The Osher Scholarship represents the largest award for reentry students on the UC Davis campus. This year, the campus awarded nine (9) \$5,000 scholarships to entering and continuing re-entry students. The application for the 2014-2015 scholarships is now open and between 8-10 **\$5,000 scholarships** will be awarded to UC Davis re-entry students.
