## **Regulatory Toxicologist/Environmental Scientist**

## Nguyen Lab Assistant (Part time)

## **UCLA Public Health Scholars (Stipend)**

#### Location: Los Angeles, CA

The UCLA Public Health Scholars Training Program provides undergraduate students the opportunity to explore the field of public health through hands-on training, structured workshops, group excursions, and leadership and professional development. A cohort of 35-40 students participate in an 8-week in-residence summer training program (June 21

- August 14, 2020). Scholars are matched with partnering organizations, where the scholars contribute to public health work 3 days per week. Scholars receive a \$3,000 stipend, housing, funding to cover some meals, and metro pass or funding for gas. By the start of the program, be enrolled in a four-year institution (community college transfers eligible) and have completed at least two years of undergraduate education *OR* graduated Spring term 2019 or after and have not officially enrolled in a graduate program. There is no GPA requirement.
